One of our main priorities remains student attendance. A key message that is shared with students is "better attendance leads to better academic outcomes". We have an aspirational target that we want all students to strive to achieve which is 96% and above and we work hard with students to achieve this. I have been working closely with Assistant Principal Mr. Hodgson to provide a range of prizes and incentives to reward students for weekly and cumulative attendance across the half-term. Our reward strategy will continue to be a key feature of our assemblies in Year 9 attendance a key criterion for participation in rewards events. # **Curriculum Spotlight**

This edition focuses on what students will be studying in English and Science during the next halfterm

In **Science** lessons Year 9 will be studying floating and sinking, which involves the how to calculate density and pressure. The periodic table, which involves the atomic model, the development and use of the periodic table.

In English Year 9 will be studying a non-fiction unit this term. They will look at how writers consciously craft pieces for effect. They will study extracts about Jean McConville and The Troubles in Northern Ireland in Patrick Radden Keefe's Say Nothing.

In addition, Year 9 will be studying Cupcakes and Kalashnikovs, a collection of journalism by women. They will also be reading letters from Hemmingway and journalists who were first on the scene at the Aberfan mining disaster.

June 2024. Students are encouraged to continue preparations with revision materials that have been provided on ClassCharts for previous assessments.




# **Reading Spotlight**

# **Trips and Events**


Well done to all students who were part of our rewards programme.
