#### **Assessment Focus**

This half term your child will be assessments sitting to inform Tracking 1 for this academic year. These will be taking place during the week commencing Monday October 2023. These tracking assessments will be taking place in classrooms during lesson time and details regarding the day/days each paper will be being sat in each subject will have been shared with your child by their class teacher.

The purpose of these assessments is to inform Tracking 1 and to identify gaps in your child's understanding. For any subjects where students are grouped based on ability, these assessments will also be used to ensure your child is in the appropriate class. This is particularly important for GCSE subjects where there are tiers as the set that your child is placed in will determine the tier that your child is entered for when they sit their exams at the end of year 10.

## **Curriculum Spotlight**



Year 10 students are completing a candy project focusing on the formal elements within Art and Design. The have learned photography skills and observational drawing skills whilst exploring a range of 2D media. They have also learned how to develop presentation skills and technique to display their artwork in the best possible way. Students have also learned how to annotate their work through reflective recording of ideas and thoughts and using subject specific vocabulary.

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


Students have started the year looking at basic carpentry joints and have focussed on producing a door frame for their first practical assessment. They have spent their theory lessons looking at identifying hazards and risks in the construction setting, focussing on implementing control measures to make the work environment safer.

Students have been looking into industry. How products are made and the different aspects it takes to produce the products we use daily. Students moved on to looking at the development of products, how and why a product can change over time before beginning their first practical project. Here the students have manipulated timber to form curves and shapes which will be fixed to create a desk lamp.

Further information about the books available to buy, and the timings for the book fair, will be shared two weeks before.






