Curriculum Spotlight

Year 11 is an important time as students prepare for their GCSEs. At the academy, we are committed to supporting all students to achieve their best possible outcomes.

One key part of this support is our 'Boost & Secure' programme, a series of after-school sessions led by subject experts. These sessions are designed to address gaps in knowledge, strengthen exam techniques, and teach independent revision strategies.

To support wellbeing, there are no mandatory sessions on Monday or Friday. Sessions run in cycles throughout the year, with the following structure:

- **Tuesday:** English Boost & Secure
- **Wednesday:** Maths Boost & Secure
- **Thursday:** Personalised support based on student needs

These sessions are as important as regular lessons, so students are expected to attend punctually, be ready to learn, and demonstrate excellent attitude. Detentions on Boost & Secure days begin at 3:30 pm if required.
