Curriculum Spotlight

This term in History, students will be studying Medieval Power answering the Enquiry Question of 'Who held the power in the Medieval World'. Using evidence, students will explore how the power of the monarchy was challenged, looking at the church, the barons, peasants and some powerful women! Also, students will also look at one of the richest men in History, Mansa Musa, answering the Enquiry Question of 'What was the significance of Mansa Musa for the Medieval World?'.

This half term, year 7 students will be learning about development through the comparison of two cities -Manchester and Mumbai. Students will learn about how the lives, economy and industry found within these two cities compares, as well as how slum developments formed in both.
