Curriculum Spotlight

The curriculum spotlight this half term will focus on Performing Arts.

In Year 8, students are introduced to Performing Arts and get the opportunity to choose what subject they focus on. All students have a lesson of Music but can either opt for Dance, Drama or

Assessment Focus

Reading in R2L




The 12 Books of Christmas
