Hello all and welcome to the first edition of our Year 9 newsletter!




Curriculum Spotlight

English – HT1: Students studied Willy Russell's play Blood Brothers which revolves around twin brothers, Mickey and Edward, who are separated at birth and are brought up in very different environments.

HT2: Students will be studying the novel The Hate You Give following the story of Starr Carter who is constantly switching between two worlds - the poor, mostly black neighbourhood where she lives and the wealthy, mostly white prep school that she attends. After witnessing a horrific murder Starr must find her voice and decide to stand up for what's right. During the unit, pupils will produce a number of pieces of rhetoric to help them develop finding their voice.

History – HT1: Students have read historical interpretations and studied historical sources when learning about women's suffrage in the 20th century and how the campaign for women's right to vote began peacefully with the Suffragists, and ended violently with the Suffragettes.

HT2: Students will be studying World War One and learn about the experiences of soldiers on the front line, as well as the experiences of civilians on the home front.
