## **Home Learning Focus**

Year 11 have been demonstrating consistently how committed they are to their home learning picking up nominations for best homework and smashing the leader board for revision.

Just a reminder about what we expect of students in Year 11 in regards to home learning and revision.

•Attend all boost sessions this will be part of your revision for the evening.

•**Create a revision timetable** but not working to an unreasonable hour.

•**Create a learning space** similar to the exam environment (silence with no distractions).

•Make sure each **revision session** is 30 – 45 minutes long.

•Make the most of the **different Apps** that are available for each subject.

•Use **Class Charts** to support their learning. Parents can also access Class Charts and discuss their progress with them.

For reading at home please encourage them to read the set texts for their English Literature exam.




What an incredible night at Sutton Rocks!
