Attendance and Academic Achievement matter

Regular attendance ensures that students get the best possible outcomes from their period in compulsory education. This also contributes to minimising the likelihood of a young person not being in education, training or employment post 16 years; reducing social exclusion and improving their chances of employment in the longer term.

Research has shown that students with over 95% attendance are three times more likely to achieve a grade 4 or above. Being absent adds to the pressures of academy life with a lot of work being missed (please see the table below).

My child will be absent

If your child is ill and they need to stay at home, please only keep them off for as long as is absolutely necessary and report all absences to the Attendance line on 01744 678859 or via the Gateway app. You should report each day your child is off. We may ask for medical evidence for periods of prolonged or persistent absence and if we notice patterns of absence through illness we will invite you in for a health meeting to discuss any additional support that may be required.
