Personal Development

Students at The Sutton Academy follow a 'Personal Social Health and Economic' education program of study which complies with statutory guidelines. Our Personal Development curriculum is delivered through our Ready to Learn sessions, PSHE lessons, assemblies, extra-curricular activities, external guest speakers and through our four core values.

This half-term in PSHE, all students have been focussing on the topic of Relationships and Sex Education. Year 9 students also participated in a contraceptive talk delivered by Teenage Advice Zone (TAZ).

In our Ready to Learn programme, students engage with the importance of attendance, mental wellbeing and reading. In addition, this half-term students have been exploring 'Careers and Aspirations' topics. The careers element of the curriculum, like the PSHE curriculum, is sequenced in an age appropriate way that aligns with Government guidelines and Gatsby Benchmarks.

Attendance

I recently wrote to all parents about the importance of attendance. Thank you to the number of parents/ carers who contacted me providing their support with this. A reminder that every day does count in a child's education, and those students with better attendance leave with better qualifications and a greater number of everyday experiences with their peers.

Standards (a regular reminder):

We firmly believe that students' education should not be hampered by a lack of equipment. Below is a list of equipment that is non-negotiable so that students can access their learning.

- A bag that can at least hold a PE kit, exercise books and equipment. Any bag that cannot hold these items is not a suitable bag.
- Pen, pencil, ruler, eraser, pencil sharpener.
- A green and purple pen (provided by the academy)
- PE kit on those days they have PE. Students will be expected to borrow a kit if they forget their own.

To make sure that the staffs focus can be on students' learning and wellbeing, can we please make sure that students return back with the **correct** shoes and uniform. Students are not permitted to wear false nails, nail varnish, fake eye lashes or dye their hair an unnatural colour. Further information can be found on the Uniform section of the academy website. There has recently been an increase in a small number of students wearing fake eye lashes and nails, which has led to them being removed from lessons until they are removed. Please support the academy by making sure these are removed before your child attends.
