Year 13 Mock 'A-Level' Results Day - Monday 15 December 2025

Dear Parent/Carers,

As we move further into the final year for our Year 13 students, we would like to keep you fully informed about their progress and the next steps in supporting them towards successful Post-18 destinations. Next week, we will be holding a Mock 'A-Level' Results Day to share with students, and you, their predicted grades based on the recent mock examinations. These grades will also be used to support their ongoing UCAS applications and University offers.

These predictions have been generated from students' performance in the Tracking-1 Mock Examinations sat in November 2025. Based on this performance, teachers have predicted a grade which students are expected to achieve if they continue to work in the same way in which they are currently. Students will also receive important information regarding their predicted UCAS points which will help inform UCAS applications.

We believe that transparent communication is key in helping students stay focused, motivated, and confident as they work toward their goals. Your support at home, combined with the feedback they receive from teachers, will be essential in the months ahead.

Following the Mock 'A-Level' Results Day, we will be taking the following steps to further support students:

Target Setting:

Students will meet with their subject teachers to identify key priorities and personalised targets, based on their mock examination outcomes.

Intervention and Support Sessions:

Where needed, students will be invited to subject-specific intervention sessions, revision workshops, or additional study support.

UCAS and Post-18 Guidance:

For students still finalising their UCAS applications or exploring alternative pathways, our Sixth Form Team will continue providing personalised guidance to ensure all applications are accurate and submitted on time.
