Once again, we find ourselves facing uncertain terms and we understand that this uncertainty can create anxiety for our students. I therefore wanted to write to you all to inform you of our incentive scheme we are launching to reward our sixth form students. There are three parts to this scheme.

1) Sixth Form Great British Bake Off:

Every Monday power point will be uploaded to Satchel One which will detail the recipes and instructions for two dishes, one sweet and one savoury. Students can choose a recipe to cook, or if they feel more daring they can cook both. Once completed, they can take a photograph of the dish and send to myself via Satchel One or email to enter the competition. 2) Sixth Form Photography Challenge:

A weekly themed photography challenge will also be uploaded to Satchel One. For example, this week's challenge is 'winter in lockdown'. Students can upload a maximum of two entries a week. 3) Home Learning Heroes:

Students will be nominated by their teachers based on their attendance to online lessons and engagement with remote learning tasks.
