WHAT DO I NEED TO STUDY THIS COURSE?

The entry requirements for this course are grade 6 at GCSE Spanish.

IS THIS COURSE FOR ME?

A level Spanish is an interesting, exciting and challenging course with stimulating content that will allow you to develop your linguistic skills alongside your understanding of the culture and society of Spanish speaking countries.

Through the course, you will study technological and social change, looking at the multicultural nature of Hispanic society. You will also study highlights of Hispanic artistic culture, including a focus on Spanish regional identity and the cultural heritage of past civilisations. The course will also allow you the opportunity to explore the influence of the past on present-day Hispanic communities. A level Spanish also offers you the opportunity to study texts and films in Spanish and carry out an independent research project on an area of your choice.

WHERE WILL THIS COURSE TAKE ME?

Studying Spanish A level at such a high level opens many doors. Many students go on to study a wide range of courses in Higher Education alongside Spanish such as another language, medicine, business and law. Studying a language at A level demonstrates that you have the ability to deal with problems logically, have excellent oral and written communication skills and have the ability to complete independent tasks – skills which are vital in the work place.
